

A snapshot of Children and Young People in NSW

NSW is home to more than 1.4 million children aged 0-14, two-thirds of whom live in Greater Sydney. NSW is also the state with the highest number of Indigenous children and youth (72,562). More than 1.9 million families live in NSW with an average of 1.9 children per family. Around 45 per cent are couple families with children, 36 per cent are couple families without children and 16 per cent are one-parent families. Almost one third of Australian children and two-thirds of refugee children live in NSW.



Substantiated child protection investigations have steadily increased over the last five years in NSW.

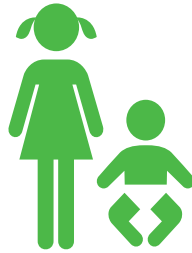
In 2016, 17,282 children were the subject of a substantiated report of child abuse or neglect in NSW.

In 2014, 49% of children admitted to out-of-home care in NSW were under 5 years of age.

The number of children in care and protection orders in NSW has increased 17% since 2010.

Almost 18,000 children in NSW are unable to live with their parents.

Key issues facing Australia's families

Family violence: The most common reason for people to experience homelessness in NSW (31% of cases) is to escape domestic violence and relationship issues. (Homelessness Australia 16)

Suicide: Ten children and young people died from suspected suicide in 2012 – the highest number of suicide deaths of children known to Community Services in the last five years. (NSW GOVT 12)

Neglect: Neglect (34%) and emotional abuse (33%) are the most common types of maltreatment suffered by children in NSW, followed by sexual abuse (18%) and physical (15%). (AIHW 2014/15)

Aboriginal children in care: The rate of Aboriginal children in out-of-home care in NSW is 10 times the rate for non-Aboriginal children. (AIHW 2015/16)

Juvenile detention: On an average day in NSW there are 371 10-17 year olds in custody, 38 per cent more than the national average. (NSW Commission for Children and Young People 11)

Homelessness: More people are experiencing homelessness in NSW (28,191) than in any other state. More than 22 per cent are aged 0-18 years. (Homelessness Australia 16)

Alcohol & substance abuse: 17% of parents reported their children had been affected in some way by the drinking behaviour of another person. (Laslett et al., 2015)

Mental illness: Around 20 per cent of Australians are affected by mental illness every year, including one third of young people before the age of 25. (Sane Australia 13)

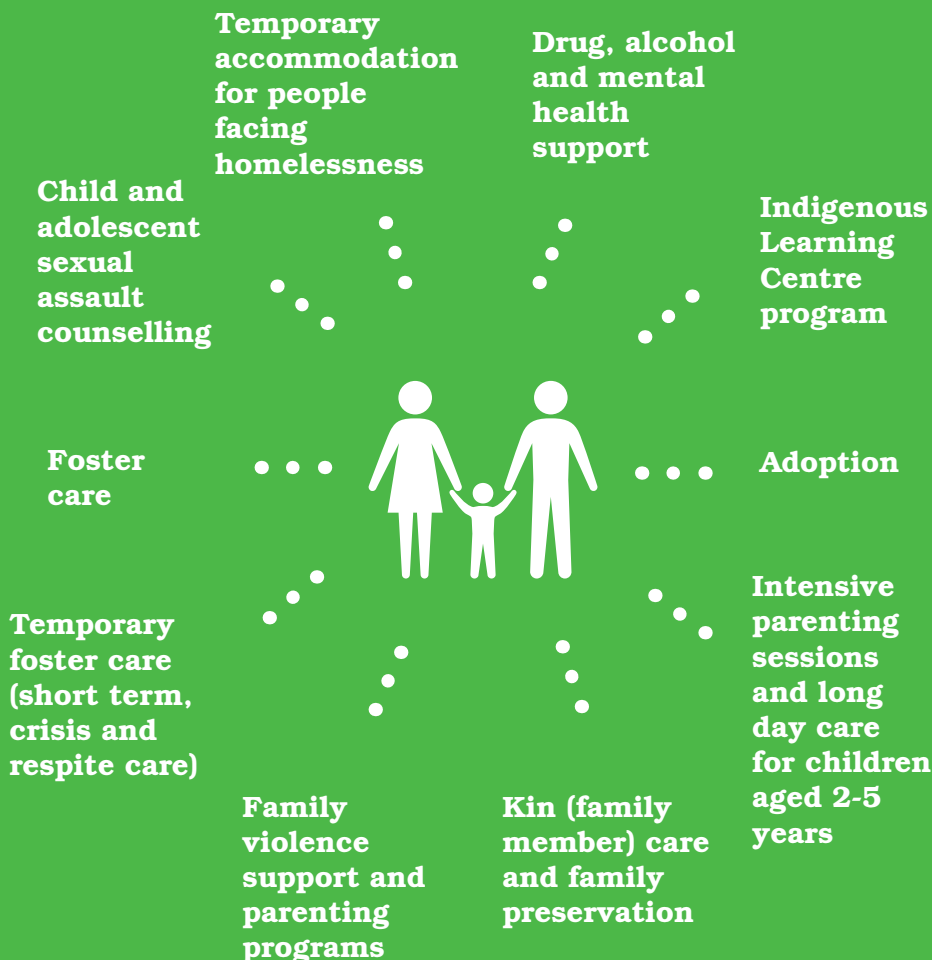
Barnardos Australia works with families to ensure children and young people are protected and nurtured within their own homes. We also find homes for abused or neglected children through foster care and adoption.
