Almost 48,000 Australian children and young people are living in out-of-home care due to abuse or neglect.

41% (or almost 20,000) of children and young people have been in out-of-home care for five years or more.

The number of young people aged 15-17 years who were the subject of a substantiated report of abuse or neglect has increased almost **27**% since 2012.

47% or more than 22,000 children in out-of-home care are aged 10-17 years.
