Australian young people are aged 12–18 years, representing 8% of the population.

## Did you know?

**1 in 6** Australians aged 15-24 years are living in poverty.

Almost **48,000** Australian children and young people are living in out-of-home care due to abuse or neglect.

**41%** (or almost 20,000) of children and young people have been in out-of-home care for five years or more.

The number of young people aged 15-17 years who were the subject of a substantiated report of abuse or neglect has increased almost **27%** since 2012.

**47%** or more than 22,000 children in out-of-home care are aged 10-17 years.

# How we help

## Our young people

The young people referred to Barnardos have endured significant hardship in their adolescent years. Many have been hurt or neglected by the very people meant to care for and protect them.

They often feel angry, frustrated and alone and need support and guidance to help steer their lives in the right direction.

## Our services for young people

Barnardos Australia youth programs provide services for young people aged 12-18 years who are unable to live at home safely.

- ▶ Reconnect Program - aims to reconnect young people with their families to prevent youth homelessness.
- ▶ Streetwork "youth outreach" Program - supports disengaged young people who have drug and alcohol issues, and are disconnected from family, education and their community.
- ▶ Joint Support Program - provides support to young people involved in the Juvenile Justice system in the areas of education, employment and accommodation.
- ▶ Temporary Accommodation Program - provides safe accommodation for young people facing homelessness.
