What is the survey about?

This study is part of the work of Barnardos Australia on domestic and family violence and its impact on children.

A short survey is being undertaken by Urbis on behalf of Barnardos Australia. This survey offers adult Australians the opportunity to:

SHARE their experience of exposure to domestic and family violence as a child or young person, and the impact it has had on their day to day life.
