Jill Coggan doesn't know where she'd be today without her adoptive mother's big heart. At 76, she is proud to share her love with the next generation.


Jill's mother Margaret was a single woman in her 40s, a well-loved and respected member of the community who volunteered during the war with Dr. Barnardos services in England.
