

## 1. Purpose

The safety and wellbeing of children is paramount for Barnardos. The *Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy* explains the principles and commitments informing our approach to children's safety and wellbeing and outlines related roles and accountabilities.

### 2. Policy Statement

For Barnardos, children come first. Children have the right to be safe from abuse and neglect; to be empowered and heard; and to reach their full developmental potential.

We emphasise prevention and early intervention approaches in working with children and their families and carers. We make decisions based on children's best interests.

Our policies, procedures and practices optimise children's safety, wellbeing and healthy development. We prioritise continuous improvement.

#### 3. Scope

The Policy applies to all Barnardos employees (including Board members, staff, volunteers, students and contractors) and carers (including their adult household members) at all sites in NSW and the ACT.

This policy applies to all physical and online environments in Barnardos wherever children are participating in activities, programs and services. This policy should be read in conjunction with the Barnardos Child Safety and Wellbeing procedure, Barnardos Code of Conducts and Barnardos Practice Framework.

#### 4. Definitions

A **child/ren** is defined as a person under the age of 18 years.

**Child abuse** includes "All forms of physical and/or emotional ill-treatment, sexual abuse, neglect or negligent treatment or commercial or other exploitation, resulting in actual or potential harm to the child's health, survival, development or dignity in the context of a relationship of responsibility, trust or power".<sup>1</sup>

#### 5. Principles & Statement of Commitments

Barnardos:

- Promotes and protects children's rights.
- Values and listens to children's voices and supports children to participate in decisions that affect them.
- Demonstrates inclusive practice when engaging and working with children and their families and carers.
- Recognises and embeds children's safety and wellbeing as the paramount consideration in our policies, procedures and practices.

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- Implements strategic and dynamic approaches to preventing, identifying and managing risks to children's safety and wellbeing.
- Takes all possible actions to recruit and retain employees and carers who are safe and suitable to work with children.
- Trains, supervises and supports employees and carers to understand and meet their responsibilities to uphold children's rights and keep them safe.
- Empowers, educates and supports children to speak up about their safety concerns.
- Empowers, and supports people to speak up about child safety concerns.
- Ensures that child safety concerns, allegations and incidents are reported, recorded and responded to in accordance with all relevant policy, legislative and regulatory obligations.
- Takes a child focused approach to handling and resolving complaints.
- Respects children's privacy while sharing information relevant to the safety and wellbeing of children when it is necessary and appropriate to do so.
- Facilitates continuous practice improvement, informed by robust analysis, in the interests of the ongoing safety and wellbeing of children.

#### 6. Responsibilities

Against the principles and commitments outlined above, the following table summarises the related roles and responsibilities within Barnardos.

## 7. Monitoring and Review

The policy will be reviewed at least every three years unless an early review is required due to legislative or organisational changes. This policy will be communicated to children and young people, their families and carers.
