Issues facing children and young people in the ACT



Neglect is the second most common type of maltreatment suffered (when stated) by children in the ACT (21%), after **emotional** (22%), followed by **physical** (14%) and **sexual** (2%).

Issues facing children and young people in NSW



There were **35,011** people in NSW classified as homeless on Census night 2021, with 4,232 being children under 12 and 2,777 aged 12-18 years; an increase from 2016 of 6.8% and 3.7% respectively.
