Out-of-home care

45,400 children and young people are unable to live with their parents due to abuse and neglect. About **3 in 5 (or 27,700)** children were aged 5–14 years.

Substance abuse

Suicide & self-inflicted injuries was the **leading specific cause** of burden in males aged 15-24 years. Anxiety disorders was the leading specific cause in females.

1 in 7 children and young people aged 4 - 17 years experience a mental health condition in any given year.

Over 28,000 young people aged 12-24 years were estimated to be homeless on Census night 2021.

Within one year of exiting out-of-home care, 50% of care leavers will be unemployed, in jail, homeless or become a new parent.
